Traffic Safety - At the Camelford Network meeting held on the 11th September it was agreed that £5000 would be allocated to Warbstow Parish to improve the safety of Parish roads in year 3 (2020/21).

Following a meeting in Warbstow with Oliver James from Cornwall Council Highways and Barry Jordon, Oliver James said that proposed designs for improvements should now be available in the new year. These will include mirrors opposite Tredown lane, the give way sign to be moved at the war memorial exit and white lines to be re-painted and the review of speed limits through the villages.

Community Centre - Planning for the 14 extra parking spaces outside the Community Centre has now been approved, so we should soon be able to enjoy the benefits - grasscrete laid and stones removed - which will ease local parking at school times.

After emailing Land Ownership at Cornwall Council, they confirm that the Community Centre and adjacent land, which is owned by Cornwall Council, was leased on 1st April 2017 for 125 years to Aspire Academy Trust. The Parish Council was not informed of this beforehand. The Parish Council will be obtaining a copy of the lease for their records. The maintenance of the Community Centre grounds and hedges will now be the responsibility of The Aspire Academy Trust.

Defibrillator - Both Trelash and Canworthy Water defibrillators are now up and running. Thank you to all who supported us, painting, installing and achieving this great result. Cont....

Camelford Medical Centre - Please help us to support action to improve the facilities, and include dental and pharmacy services to Camelford Health Centre. We have dropped down the list for improvements despite NHS England awarding £750,000 towards the improvements. We wish to raise the profile ensuring we secure the funding and achieve the targets. A Petition is being posted on the Warbstow Parish website (thank you Paul). All help we can get greatly appreciated. Please return completed petition sheets to me, Jan Carter.

School Parking - I have received an email from a resident of Knapmedown, Rose Wallington. Rose is concerned about the parking and the entrance to Knapmedown, stating that it's a hazard and she was concerned about emergency vehicles not being able to enter the road during school times. The school has been sent a copy of the email and said they will mention this in their Newsletter, making parents aware of the extra parking now available at the Community Centre.

THE WARBSTOW GIANT

*In ancient days beyond our ken
When Elvish folk were known to Men
The giants dwelt on high hilltops
And built their castles from the rocks.*

*And from on high, the lands around
All could be seen, theirs to command.
No man or Elf or sorcerer
Could challenge or defeat their power.*

*Legends they are, and legends they say
Far from the truth are oft to stray.
One giant of the North would stand
Protecting folk from roaming bands.*

*On Warbstow Bury he could see
Great distances from moors to sea
And with his sling would hurl great stones
If invaders came to raid folks' homes.*

*Well fond of games like quoits was he
With village children made merry
And when at last his grave he found
Much moaning could be heard around.*

These are the lyrics to 'The Warbstow Giant', a song written by local songwriter Chris Hytch, who recently recorded it in his music studio, The Piggery, and also produced a video. Chris says of the song:

"I decided to depict 'our' giant as being of the good natured variety, similar to the Carn Galver giant, near Zennor, who is said to have protected local people from other giants in return for the gift of the occasional cow and goat. This giant even befriended a young man named Choon, and played quoits with him. This behaviour is in contrast to the ...giants Cormoran and Bolster, for example, who are rumoured to have stolen cattle and even children to satisfy their appetites"!

“Little seems to be known of the Warbstow Giant other than the manner of his death. As seems to have been common amongst the giants, a pastime of theirs was to throw their cobbling hammers to each other to amuse themselves. It was during a game such as this that he was killed by a hammer thrown by the Launceston giant.”

Chris, a former music producer, whose songs and tracks have been played on BBC 2, BBC Radio WM and Radio Cornwall , has written, recorded and performed several songs about Cornish legends, including one about a ‘browney’ who seems to be sharing his cottage with him and his wife! Chris plans to shoot more videos of these songs over the next year....so if you see a wandering minstrel up on the Bury now you know who it is.

At the time of writing the local primary school are planning to teach the song to the children to enter local competitions. Chris will also be entering it for next year’s Gorsedh as an example of Cornish culture.

Chris regularly plays at local venues including monthly at the Songwriters Showcase, which he organises, at The Legion Hall, Crackington. He also plays monthly at The Acoustic Mill sessions at The Mill House, Trebarwith Strand and occasionally at the Real Junk Food Project, St. Kitts Herbery on the A39 near Camelford.

COOKS CORNER - SEASONAL FARE

Gill and I decided this year to do some of our favourite recipes. I hope you will enjoy them too.

Gerry's Easy Thai Fish Curry

Ingredients;

5 Frozen Cod fillets
100g Frozen Prawns
50g Frozen Peas
1 large Onion finely chopped
3 Garlic Cloves crushed
1 400g Tin Coconut milk
1 large knob of butter
1 tablespoon cooking oil (rapeseed preferred)
2 tablespoon Thai Green Curry Paste
1 teaspoon dried Coriander
1 teaspoon dried Chives
½ teaspoon dried Dill
1 heaped tablespoon Crunchy Peanut Butter
1 tablespoon Ground Almonds
2 tablespoons Greek style yoghurt
The juice of 1 lemon
Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

Method

1. In a large wok or saucepan melt the butter and the oil. Do not allow the butter to burn. When hot add the onion and fry gently
2. After 5 mins add the garlic and continue to fry until the onions are translucent.
3. Add the Thai Green curry paste and a cup of water to the onions and stir in the paste to coat the onions then add the coconut milk and simmer gently.
4. When the mixture is bubbling add the frozen cod, the chives, coriander and the dill. A little water can be added to ensure the fish is just covered. Put on a lid and simmer for 8 minutes.
5. At 6 mins stir in the crunchy peanut butter.

Cont....

- 6.. Use a wooden spoon to gently break up the cod fillets into slightly smaller pieces
7. At 8 mins add to the pan the frozen peas and the prawns bring back to the simmer for a further 3 mins.
8. Stir in the Greek yoghurt.
9. Take off the heat and allow to stand. After a couple of mins stir in lemon juice and the ground almonds and serve.

Serve with Jasmine rice. Serves 4.

5. **Network Meeting** Lynette Hutchinson and Jan Carter attended the

Network meeting on the 11th September. The expression of interest had already been sent in and accepted prior to the meeting. It was agreed that Warbstow could have £5000 to improve road safety allocated in year 3, however it may not take that long. Total project funding has been proportioned over 4 years for all of the Area.

Camelford Medical Centre - It was reported that the building is not fit for purpose. The medical centre will either have to move to another building or the current building have the necessary work undertaken. Camelford Health Hub are also looking for a solution with the issues of new GP provision (national issue for rural areas) More updates at the next Network meeting. Free parking in Camelford is under debate once again (at the moment). More information to follow at the next meeting that meeting has been scheduled for 11th December but this is yet to be confirmed. Lynette and Jan to both attend.

6. Speed Watch Update Terry Luckwell reported that he had various emails to and from the PCSO to find out who the contact is for Speed Watch. He has now been informed that it is PCSO Lawrence Hambrook, we had previously been given the wrong information. The Road Safety team will visit, the road needs to be assessed again with a speed camera to see if there is a problem. All the paperwork for volunteers has to be completed again.

A report has been produced by Cormac for Radarclass which monitored the speed of traffic at Fonston, Canworthy Water between the 3rd and the 11th July. The residents are unhappy with these results, only 3% exceeded the speed limit. They feel it wasn't in the right location to record an accurate speed of all vehicles.

Speeding / Junction meeting with Oliver Jones and Barry Jordan

Lynette Hutchinson and Terry Luckwell attended a meeting on the 12th September with Oliver Jones and Barry Jordan. Discussions included: Speed of traffic, Pot holes, Give Way sign to be moved to be visible earlier, at War Memorial, Repainting the lines outside Trewlaney House, and Mirrors installed opposite Tredown Lane. Oliver Jones has sent a follow up e-mail to say he should have some proposal designs early in the new year.

7. Finance

7.1 Lynette Hutchinson talked through the bank reconciliation. A cheque had been written out for £41.40 to the Inland Revenue which will now be destroyed as Lynette has discovered that we have a credit with them of £161.70. This credit is back dated from April 2017.

Peter Jeffs could have access to cross the land but he can't disturb it, make any changes to the surface or enhance the entrance. All in agreement.

It was agreed by all in principal however there were discussions on the quality of the system. Lynette will reply and ask for justification for the choice and to check reviews on this model. It would be a good idea to look at another model for a comparison.

Many of you will have seen or been made aware of the proposed merger of the Devon & Cornwall Police with the Dorset Police and I attended the adoption of the Conservative candidate Alison Hernandez for the next term as Police and Crime Commissioner. Ms Hernandez explained why she had changed her mind and it boiled down to Cornwall & Devon getting the raw deal but we do need more police officers to stop rural crime along with urban crime which is on the increase as farmers are losing machinery and animals. This needs to be stopped and the criminals brought to justice. We need to put pressure on our Police Commissioner and Chief Constable to increase the force to protect everyone.

The one big issue that has come to light recently is the Urgent Care Centres. We had been assured that Launceston hospital "Minor Injuries Unit" would be a serious contender but the KCCG (Kernow Clinical Commissioning Group) think that Penzance (West) Truro (West) and Bodmin (Mid) would be the best choices. What about us in the North and the East of Cornwall? We have been totally ignored yet again. I have written to Jackie Pendleton CEO (KCCG) asking for a copy of the consultation document which I am still waiting for and pointed out that our area has approx 90,000 people, almost 20% of the local population, and asking why have we been ignored again? There is very little public transport in some places and no direct public transport to Bodmin, Truro or Plymouth. Often some of us in North Cornwall will end up in Barnstaple where there is no public transport at all. Cornwall Council and the government want to reduce the amount of carbon emissions yet the KCCG have totally ignored that. I urge everyone who believes that we should get a better deal in Launceston to either email Jackie Pendleton at j.pendleton@nhs.net or write to her at NHS Kernow Clinical Commissioning Group, Sedgemoor Centre, Priory Road, St Austell, Cornwall. PL25 5AS requesting that our area be given a better chance of getting urgent medical care.

Unless we shout we will be ignored and the more of us that put our heads above the parapet the better chance we have of changing minds and decisions. If you are unsure please contact me and I will send you a copy of the letter and email that I have already sent.

Never a stroll in the park! I often found myself herded into a cubicle with an armful of clothes, and Wendy telling me to try it on, it will suit you! MY FASHION GURU!
